Thank you for considering us for your horse's needs.

**Boarding at The Heritage:** We offer Modified Stall Board. This service offers most of the amenities of full board: They come into their stall twice a day for feedings and then get turned back out to the pastures. We only keep horses in stalls during extreme weather conditions. Quality Costal Bermuda hay or pastures are available at all times. We feed Bartlett Feed (10%Protein, 6%Fat mix -max amt. of 4lbs. 2x/day) which is formulated by the KER. Supplements will be administered daily, in AM, if provided by owner, and any additional requirements or different feed product are at the complete expense of the owner.

It is recommended that you provide a lightweight waterproof sheet (preferably a Rambo) for protection during inclement winter weather. Horses are blanketed with one waterproof sheet OR mid weight blanket (max 200 Gms) in the winter when temperatures drop to 30F or below or there is a cold rain. We generally do not have weather requiring confinement of horses or heavy weight blankets. Only blanket WITHOUT rear leg straps will be applied to horses, for the safety of our handlers.

**Pastures:** We have a 120-acre farm with 20 acres divided into five separate pastures and multiple trails. All pastures are fenced with either PVC or smooth wire and electric. Fresh water and trace mineral salt blocks are available at all times. Three smaller paddocks are available for short term individual use at an extra fee but we do not have availability for long term, individual turnout. Mares and geldings are pastured separately and there are generally 3 to 8 horses per pasture depending on the size of the pasture.

**The Barn:** Is a 12-stall facility with a security system installed and Owner's live on the property. Stalls are 12x12 with sliding doors to the interior aisle, and windows to the outside. Stalls have rubber mats and are bedded with sawdust. A hot/cold wash rack and several crossties in the hallway are provided for grooming. The tack room has permanent saddle racks and bridle hooks and has a security lock with code.

**Riding Facilities:** A 100' x 200' sand lighted riding arena, a 60' diameter round pen, and a separate jump field are available along with trails through our woods. There are also trails around the Clemson area for your riding enjoyment.

**Health Care:** The Heritage requires that all horses receive WEST NILE, EEE, WEE, TETANUS, FLU, RHINO, and STRANGLES vaccinations in the spring and EEE, WEE, TETANUS, FLU, RHINO and RABIES in the fall. A yearly COGGINS is also required. Horses are dewormed on a rotational schedule along with fecal testing as part of our boarding program and as prescribed by our vet. \* DEWORMING INCLUDES ONE TUBE OF DEWORMER, EXTRA REQUIREMENTS WILL BE ADDED TO YOUR BILL.\*. Our farm's vet visits our farm 2x/year for vaccinations and any other medical needs your horse may have at those times. The use of a different vet is at owner's discretion. All vet bills will be the responsibility of the owner and arrangements for payment should be made with the Vet Clinic. In the event of a medical emergency or injury, the veterinarian on call will be contacted by management and the owner notified.

**Farrier Services:** The farrier for The Heritage is Steve Fox of Seneca, SC. who makes regular visits to the farm every five to six weeks. He is knowledgeable in normal and corrective trimming and shoeing. If you are interested in having Steve shoe your horse and cannot be here, please make arrangements with Management, we can handle your horse for a minimal charge. If a different farrier is preferred, owners are responsible for the arrangements and NO farrier is to work on any horse without the owner in attendance. Unless prior arrangements are made, farrier fees are due at the time the service is rendered.

### **BARN REGULATIONS**

THESE REGULATIONS ARE IN PLACE TO PROTECT ALL OF OUR COLLECTIVE INVESTMENTS OF HORSES, TACK, AND FACILITIES. **NO EXCEPTIONS TO THESE RULES!**

1. **NO SMOKING** in barn.
2. **NO OUTSIDE DOGS** allowed onto the property.
3. **Children must be attended in or around the barn areas at all times.**
4. **Clearly Label ALL** of your tack and equipment.
5. **It is the responsibility of ALL BOARDERS to keep the tack room CLEAN and NEAT.**
6. **Keep "COMMON USE AREAS" both inside the barn and outside in the yard clear of trash and manure. CLEAN UP "BEHIND" YOUR HORSE PROMPTLY so everyone can enjoy the premises.**
7. **LOST & FOUND: ALL equipment must fit inside your box. Any items left outside your box will be added to our "Lost & Found" and charged \$1.00 per item to reclaim.**
8. **Sweep the Wash Rack clean before and after you use it. Do not leave dirt, hair, or manure behind. Groom your horse and clean its feet BEFORE entering the Wash Rack.**
9. **No running of horses in the "yard area" around the barn or house.**
10. **"Horse Treats" must be brought from home. DO NOT feed extra barn grain or hay.**
11. **Give treats to only your own horse. Some horses may be on restrictive diets.**
12. **Owners are to attend their OWN horse during farrier / vet visits, if unable to do so you must make arrangements with management, NOT with other owners; No Farrier is allowed to work on horses alone.**
13. **Regular inoculations administered by a vet are required in the spring and fall for every horse.**
14. **ONLY medications prescribed by a vet may be administered, except for general topicals.**
15. **Please discuss with management any "extra care" that may be needed for your horse such as administration of treatments or medications.**
16. **The Alarm System will be set after 10PM. Please notify me if you intend to come later.**
17. **Keep tack room door closed and locked at all times!**
18. **When leaving the barn, turn off all water and lights (even if you didn't turn them on).**
19. **Reconnect the electric fence over gate every time you bring a horse in or out of a pasture.**
20. **ANY RIDER UNDER 21 YEARS MUST WEAR A SAFTEY HELMET AT ALL TIMES WHILE MOUNTED.**
21. **I UNDERSTAND THAT MANAGEMENT AND FAMILY MEMBERS WILL NOT BE RESPONSIBLE FOR ANY LOSS OR DAMAGE OF HORSE, EQUIPMENT, OR PERSONS UNDER SOUTH CAROLINA LAW ARTICLE 7, CHAPTER 9 OF TITLE 47.**
